What is God's desire?

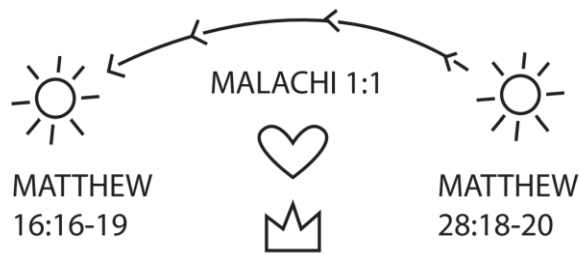
Malachi 1:11

From the rising of the sun to its setting, among all people and all places, for the Lord's name to be made great.

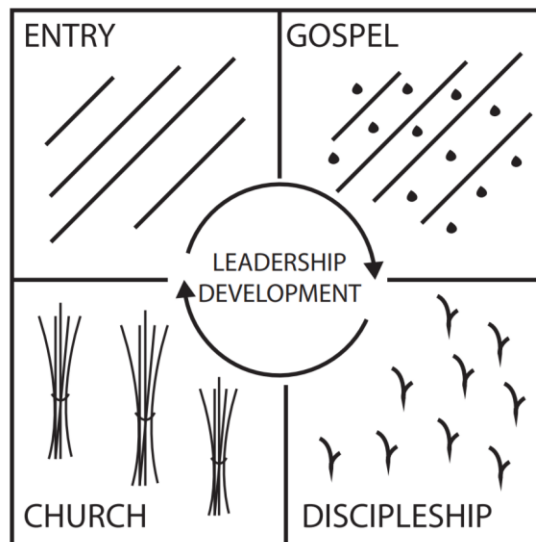
What is God's plan?

Matthew 16:16-19 & Matthew 28:18-20

Jesus said that he will build his church. We must go, share the gospel, make disciples, and gather them together. Then we must teach others to do the same.



After studying these verses, draw the picture below as a picture that helps us remember God's plan (Matthew 16:16-19 & 28:18-20) for reaching all peoples and all places.



Entry (Field 1)

There are two types of people: people you know & people you don't know. We create an oikos map to think through nonbelievers already in our lives. We study Luke 10:1-11 for how to go to people we don't know.

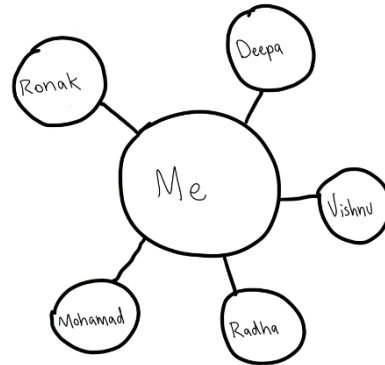
OIKOS

Read Luke 10:1-11

What did Jesus tell the disciples to do?	What did Jesus tell the disciples not to do?
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 2x2 (v. 1) • Pray (v. 2) • Go (v. 3) • Say "Peace" / greet at house (v. 5) • Stay at the house (v. 7) • Eat & drink (v. 7) • Heal the sick (v. 9) • Proclaim the kingdom / gospel (v. 9) • Wipe the dust off feet (v. 10) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Carry no moneybag, knapsack, or sandals (v. 4) • Greet no one on the road (v. 4) • Do not go from house to house (v. 7)

Conclusion: *Through Luke 10:1-11 and the passages in Acts, we can see a pattern of going 2x2, prayer, sharing the gospel, and staying in the house of those that believe.*

Ask God where you will go to do Luke 10.

Gospel (Field 2)

2-3-4

2: There are two parts: our story (testimony), and Jesus' story (gospel)

3: Our story has 3 parts-

1. Life before Jesus
2. How we met Jesus
3. Life after Jesus



4: Jesus' story has 4 parts-

1. Creation
2. Sin
3. Jesus- death, burial & resurrection (1 Cor 15:3-4)
4. Choice

The following is one simple and reproducible way to share the gospel using your hand:

FOUR FIELDS & ADDITIONAL STUDIES

1. This is God. (fingers)
This is Man. (thumb)



2. In the beginning, man had a perfect relationship with God.



3. Then Man sinned and became separated from God. We too have sinned and are separated from God. This is why we don't have peace.



4. We try to fix our relationship with God by giving Him gifts. We give things like good works, devotion and service. Man's gifts can't fix our relationship with God. We are still separated.



5. God loved us, and made a way for us to be saved. He gave us His son Jesus.



6. Jesus took the punishment for our sins. He was killed on a cross.



7. He was buried in a tomb.



8. Three days later Jesus came back to life.



9. If we believe, repent and follow Jesus then He cleanses our sins forever.



10. Through Jesus, our sins are forgiven and our relationship with God is restored, just like it was in the beginning.



11. Would you like to believe and begin following Jesus? Would you like to have your sins forgiven?



Romans 10:9 "...if you confess with your mouth Jesus as Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved;"

Discipleship (Field 3)

ACTS 2 STUDY

Read Acts 2:37-47.

What did the new believers do?

Repent & believe (v. 38)
Baptism (v. 38, 41)
Teaching (v. 42)
Fellowship (v. 42)
Lord's Supper (v. 42, 46)
Prayer (v. 42)
Wonders & signs, holy spirit (v. 43)
Apostles/leaders (v. 42-43)

Worship (v. 47)
Gospel/multiplication (v. 47)

From this passage in Acts 2, we find 7 primary lessons to teach new believers during short-term discipleship. For each lesson there is a story and command to study using the "8 step process" and questions.

1. Repent and Believe	Story: Luke 19:1-10 Command: Mark 1:14-15
2. Be Baptized	Story: Acts 8:26-39 Command: Matthew 28:18-20
3. Go and Tell	Story: John 4:1-42 Command: Mark 16:15
4. Pray	Story: Matthew 6:5-15 Command: Matthew 6:9
5. Love	Story: Luke 10:25-37 Command: Matthew 22:37-39
6. Give	Story: Mark 12:41-44 Command: Matthew 6:1-4
7. Lord's Supper	Story: Luke 22:7-20 Command: Matthew 26:26-29

8 STEP PROCESS

Below is the process used when meeting with new believers for discipleship lessons. This process will also be used when the church is meeting together.

1. Pray
2. Worship
3. Review
 - a. What did you learn last time we met?
4. Accountability
 - a. Who have you shared the Gospel with since we last met?
 - b. How did you obey what you learned last time we met?
5. New Teaching
 - a. What does this story teach us about God?
 - b. What does this story teach us about man?
 - c. Is there anything in this story we should not do (sin)?
 - d. Are there any examples in this story we should follow?
 - e. Are there any commands in this story we need to obey?
6. Practice
7. Plan
8. Pray

LONG TERM DISCIPLESHIP

After completing the 7 commands, you can use the book of Mark **or** the Creation to Christ stories for long-term discipleship. In the 8 step process, these stories can be used for Step 5 (New Teaching) with the same questions (what do we learn about god, etc.). Long-term discipleship lessons help new believers grow in their understanding of the Bible story from Genesis to Revelation.

The Creation of the World

1. Creation of the world - Genesis 1:1-2:3
2. Creation of man - Genesis 2:4-25

The Story of Sin - The Disobedience of Man

3. The first sin and judgment - Genesis 3:1-24
4. Sin spreads to the children of Adam and Eve - Genesis 4:1-16
5. Sin spreads to the whole world - The Flood - Genesis 6:11-22, 7:11-23, 8:14-22

The Story of Redemption - The Cost of Sin and the Promise of Forgiveness

6. God's promise to Abraham - Geneses 12:1-9, 15:1-6
7. God provides the substitute sacrifice for Isaac - Genesis 22:1-19
8. Abraham's descendants enslaved the God chooses Moses as liberator- Exodus 1:1-14, 3:1-14
9. The Passover - the blood and the lamb - Exodus 12:1-28
10. God gives His Ten Laws and Sacrifice for breaking the law - Exodus 20:1-21, Leviticus 4:1-4
11. God's people continually sin - Judges 2:10-23
12. God will send a redeemer - Isaiah 9:1-7 and 53

13. Birth of Jesus according to prophecy - Matthew 1:1-25
14. Baptism of Jesus - Behold the Lamb of God! The testimony of John & the Spirit - Matt. 3; John 1:29-34
15. Temptation of Christ - Matthew 4:1-11
16. Jesus has authority to forgive sin - paralyzed man and 4 friends - Luke 5:17-26
17. Jesus has power over nature - calms the sea - Mark 4:35-41
18. Jesus has authority over spirits - the Gerasene Demoniac - Mark 5:1-20
19. Jesus has power over death - Jesus raises Lazarus to life - John 11:1-45
20. Jesus is the Savior who brings Eternal Life - John 4:1-26, 39-42

21. The Last Supper - "This is my broken body and blood shed for you" Matthew 26:18-30
22. Jesus is betrayed, arrested, falsely accused, tried, and sentenced to death - John 18:1- 19:16
23. The crucifixion, decision for and against Jesus. "It is finished: - John 19:16-42
24. The resurrection and appearance to disciples and followers - Luke 24:1-35
25. Jesus returns to the Father, the Ascension - Luke 24:36-53
26. Our response - The New Birth - John 3:1-21
27. Jesus will return - 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18

The church can meet in homes, church buildings, under a tree etc.

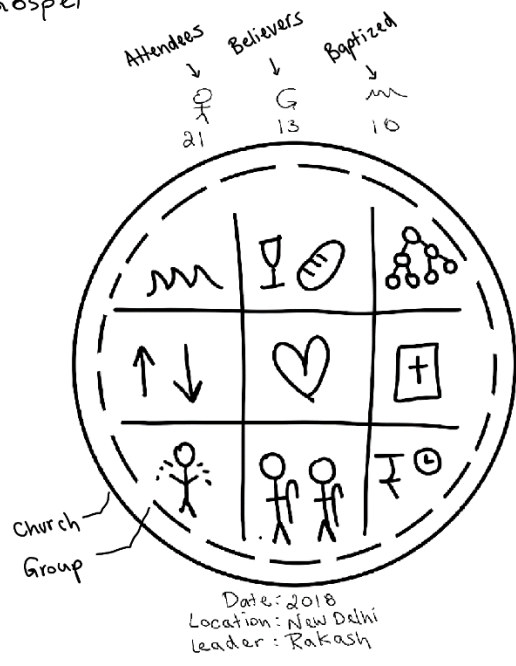
- 3) **When** does the church meet?

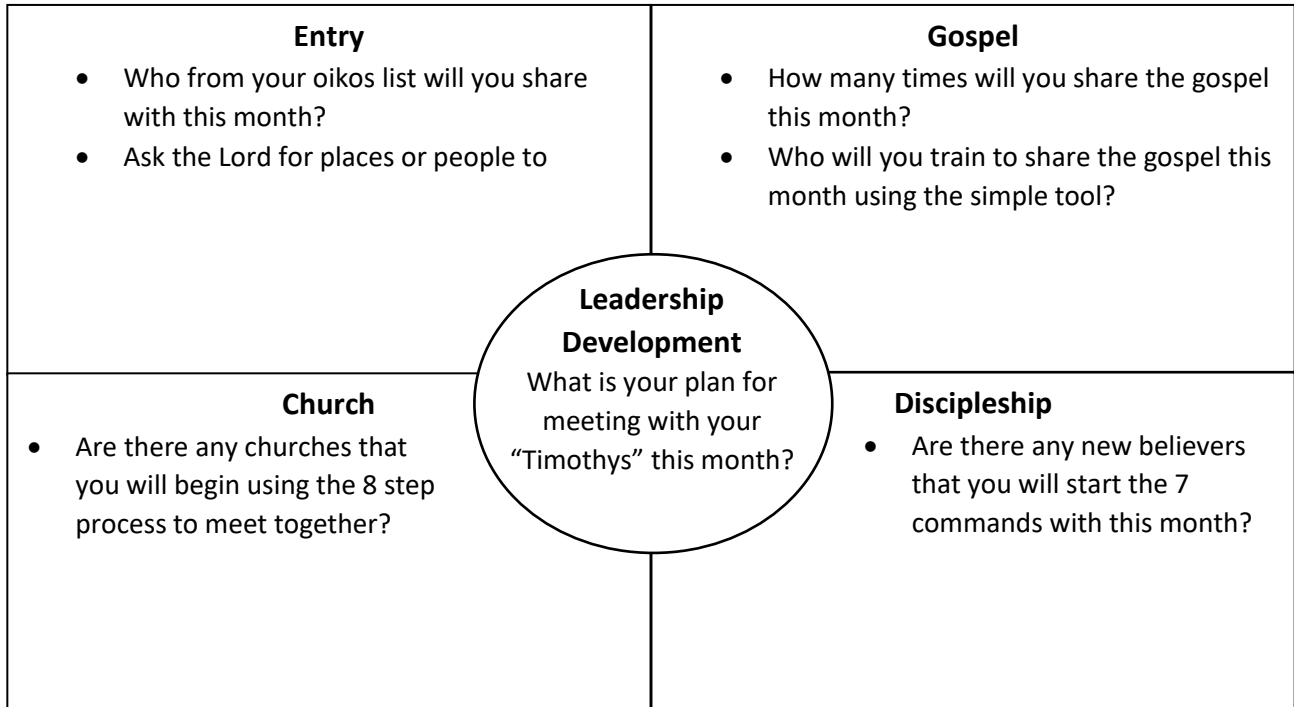
